### THE TAYLOR-EDGERLY HOME, 733 N. Cochran

One of the highlights of this year's tour will be the Taylor-Edgerly home at 733 N. Cochran. This Neo-Colonial or Colonialized Victorian home was built in 1904 by Homer Patterson and sold to Isaac Taylor in 1905. It has had numerous other owners over the years, including Elly Peterson in the late 1940's. Gaylord and Jean Edgerly bought the house in 1980 and began its restoration in 1981.

The house features a Victorian period parlor and bathroom. It is furnished with antiques purchased by Gaylord and Jean, including a walnut pump organ, circa 1900, and a rosewood square grand piano built in 1872. Family pieces include portraits from both Mr. and Mrs. Edgerly's families.

The oak and pine woodwork in the house was stripped and refinished by the Edgerlys. Several doors and a newel post were found in the basement and replaced in the home. The kitchen was recently enlarged, <sup>3/50</sup> The back stairs opened up, and the downstairs bathroom relocated to its original place. The oak fireplace, with its antique tiles, was installed by the Edgerlys also.
