The Charlotte Club began in 1887 as a literary club which enhanced the status of the individual woman and broke the conventional circumscription of her life when culture and customs were against it.

The Club developed into a group which promotes the enrichment of life.

The Club concept of “volunteerism” encouraged and supported each member’s personal growth and an overall commitment to community improvement.

GFWC resulted from the joining together of many women’s clubs at the state, national and international levels to become the largest and oldest non-denominational and non-partisan international volunteer service organization of women in the world.
