GFWC-CHARLOTTE RECEIVES GRANT FOR RIF

The RIF (Reading Is Fundamental) committee of GFWC-Charlotte recently applied for a grant to help subsidize our RIF project. Thanks to Proctor and Gamble, GFWC in Washington D.C. was able to offer grants to promote club literacy projects. The grants were based on merit, a demonstrated effort to serve the community, and project sustainability. Our application was approved and we were awarded the maximum grant of \$150.

GFWC-Charlotte has sponsored and funded the RIF program in the Charlotte schools since 1996, with a current annual budget of \$700. Due to the increased cost of books and a depleted memorial fund we have been looking for other sources of support. This grant will be welcomed assistance in continuing such a worthwhile project.

The goal of RIF is to help children understand the value of books, develop a greater interest in reading, and motivate parents and children to read together. In Charlotte, the GFWC RIF committee members visit all second graders. During these visits we read each class a story, and display the books so that each child is able to choose a book. We find that many children have never owned a book of their own and are thrilled to choose a book to keep and take home. In the past year the RIF committee has distributed 456 books to Charlotte's enthusiastic second graders.

We often receive thank you letters, and their gratitude is summed up in the words of one young man: "Thank you laidies of GFWC. The book you read us was awsum! The book I picked was awsum! And I think you are awsum!" Evidently his teacher wrote "GFWC" on the board for him but he guessed at some of the other spelling:

I would like to thank the members of GFWC-Charlotte for continuing to support such a valued program in our community. And I would especially like to thank members of the RIF committee: Lee Falik, Sharon Kubica, Jan Day, and Lorraine Green for all your hard work this year. You have developed and maintained a very worthwhile program that has touched the lives of many children and their families. I agree with the second graders you "laidies are awsum"!
