CIP: I recently had the opportunity to see all the boxes that contain our club's archives. It's a treasure trove! Our Community Improvement Project will help us preserve the archives and, at the same time, make them available to all of us. It's important to protect all the original documents, but it's also important that anyone who is interested in our rich history has the opportunity to explore it. We'll make that possible by scanning and indexing the documents. As I mentioned before, we will also be doing taped interviews with current and previous members whose memories we want to capture. This will be a two-year project and will require a lot of volunteer hours. If you are interested, but haven't signed up yet, let me know. We'd love to have your help. Our first meeting will be on October 19th at 10 a.m., at my home, 750 Linden St.

We'll be adding our volunteer hours to those of all other GFWC members throughout the nation. Fill out the form and return it to me by the December 1 deadline.

From the minutes there was discussion of a donation to be made to Girlstown. The Girlstown Project had been under consideration by the club for the previous three years, and had been accepted by all State Federation Clubs as a worthwhile project for Women's clubs in Michigan.

Over the past few years, a <u>substantial</u> bank balance had been accrued, and not needed to meet current expenses. It
was the recommendation of the Financial committee, that \$100 of the \$187.00 bank balance, be sent to the
Girlstown Building fund, as the contribution of the Charlotte Woman's club.


Celebrate National Recycling Day--November 15, 2012
